## Huntsville Soccer Club Covid 19/Influenza Pandemic

## EMERGENCY RESPONSE PLAN

The HSC has designated the HSC Club Administrator as the ERP Lead, taking on the responsibility of the Pre-Pandemic Phase, Positive Test Phase, and Post-Pandemic Phase as outlined by Ontario Soccer.

Tasks completed by the ERP Lead includes:

- Completion of the Canada Soccer Risk Assessment
- Incorporated the HSC Guidelines &Protocol, providing information to all participants, parents/guardians, coaches, program staff and HSC leadership
- Contacted local Health Authority to confirm awareness of program and that all provincial rules and guidelines are being followed

## **Positive Test Phase**

- 1. If any participant of the program (including players, parent/guardian, coach, team staff, field marshall, families of these individuals, or anyone else in close physical proximity to any of the program participants within the previous 14 days) shows symptoms of Covid19, **they must report as soon as possible to the ERP Lead**.
- Symptoms include:
  - Severe difficult breathing
  - Severe chest pain
  - Feeling confused or unsure of where you are
  - Losing consciousness
  - Fever
  - Chills
  - Cough that is new or worsening
  - 'Barking Cough'
  - Shortness of breath
  - Sore throat
  - Difficulty swallowing
  - Runny Nose
  - Stuffy or congested nose
  - Lost sense of taste or smell
  - Pink eye
  - Headache that's unusual or long lasting
  - Digestive issues like nausea/vomiting, diarrhea, stomach pain
  - Muscle aches that are unusual or long lasting
  - Extreme tiredness that is unusual
  - Falling down often
  - For young children: sluggishness or lack of appetite

2. Any individuals and their family members reporting these symptoms, positive test results, or have been in physical proximity to someone who has tested positive, are immediately withdrawn from the HSC program. They are to be advised to stay home and obtain guidance from a qualified health professional.

If the report happens during an HSC program, that person and those they have been in contact with, must be immediately isolated from the rest of the program participants. The person(s) should be immediately taken home and isolated, and their local health professional notified by them or their parent/guardian.

Transportation from the place of the HSC program should be done in a family vehicle only. Any other owner of a vehicle being used should be made aware of the potential risks. If an ambulance is called, 911 dispatchers should be notified of the Covid19 symptoms.

Any areas used by the person with Covid 19 symptoms at the place of the HSC program must be immediately closed to other participants, and eventually cleaned and disinfected using products suggested by health officials.

- 3. All other potentially infected participants, including family members, must be immediately notified by the HSC that a person had Covid19 symptoms in the program.
- 4. An 'Incident Report' must be filled out by the ERP with the assistance by program leadership and family members. The local health authority must be notified of the incident.
